#### **PE Kits**

#### Year R:

Hello Reception Parents! The children in Reception have had a fantastic few days settling into life at St Cuthbert's. Myself and Miss Constable have been so impressed with how well the children came into school for their sessions and how beautifully they have all played together as they explored their new classroom and playground. On Thursday, the children got to experience their first PE lesson with Mr Taylor and were given a tour of the whole school, then they joined the rest of the school in the hall for lunch and in the playground for playtime. Such a busy and enjoyable first few days, we are really looking forward to the rest of Autumn term!

#### Year 1:

The new Year One class have settled in beautifully. The transition is going very well and our current main focus is ensuring that we stay in our chairs and put our hand up for help. Everyone has been working very hard and the first few days have been a delight.

#### Year 2:

Year Two have had a great start to their week. The children have all settled in well to the Y2 routines. We were straight in with some RE, Maths and English to establish how to set out the books etc. The children wrote a class poem all about the rain...this will kick start the Geography unit based around Weather that we will start next week.

#### Year 3:

We have delved into observational poetry, place value and through scientific enquiry, investigating what objects are light sources or light reflectors. A gentle reminder that we will have a Stone Age workshop on 14<sup>th</sup> September, where children can dress as a prehistoric man/woman.

#### Year 4:

Year Four have settled in fantastically this week, what a delight it has been to start this new year with them! We have been getting back into school routines and getting started on some of our new topics for this year. I hope you all have a great and well-rested weekend after all your hard work this week!

#### Year 5:

We have had a nice first week back in Year 5. We have done a range of activities from writing about our summer in English to being creative with our math's learning in the outdoors. In RE we having been discussing what makes us special and what different values and qualities we each have. I am really happy with how the whole class has started Year 5 and I am confident it will continue that way.

#### Year 6:

What a super start to the year! The children have settled into the Year 6 routine and are now ready for their new responsibilities. This week we started our new RE topic, Creation and Covenant.
