The Week That Was

Year R:

This week Reception have been learning about different families. To celebrate being part of the St Cuthbert's family, we painted our hands and used them to make leaves to create a family tree in our classroom. We talked about the different people that live in our house and drew pictures of them. We also created pictures of them using natural resources, such as pine cones, acorns, sticks and shells, the children were so creative with these! We read a series of stories about "The Large Family" by Jill Murphy and talked about why we love our family and what we love to do with them. In Maths, we have been learning how to describe objects by size and how to order them from smallest to biggest. We helped the three bears to have a picnic and sorted their food by size into the three bears' different bowls.

Year 1:

This week in RE we are continuing our work on the Our Father, the children have been adding illustrations to the lines of the prayer to show what it means to them. We have also moved onto a new maths topic and will be doing part-whole model! In English, we are at the beginning of our journey writing beautiful sentences and all children have been doing well.

Year 2:

We have been very busy yet again in year 2 this week. In maths, we have finished our unit on numbers to 100 and we are now moving onto addition and subtraction. We have been counting in 2's, 5's and 10's so lots of practice of this at home would be very beneficial! We have been continuing to use the features of instructions in our writing, concentrating on vocabulary choices. In Science, we have been investigating nappies! We tested different materials for their absorbency and looked at the materials used in a nappy. We thought about the purpose of each material and why they had been used. This week we saw the start of October therefore our attention turns to Mary and the rosary. We will be saying a small section of the rosary every day in class and it would be lovely if you could join us by doing the same at home where possible!

Year 3:

In Year 3 we have been exploring why the Synagogue is a special place in our Judaism topic. We have worked collaboratively to use our prehistoric painting skills to paint our shadow puppet theatre which we used when we hosted our shadow puppet plays to reception.

Year 4:

Year Four have worked hard this week and have been starting to get to grips with rounding 4-digit numbers. They enjoyed reflecting on their last RE topic and creating their own collective worships. They have been starting to learn about the Jewish

faith this week, which they've found interesting. Well done for all of your hard work this week, Year Four!

Year 5:

This week in RE we have been learning all about Judaism. We have discussed the Jewish festival of Passover and why it is called that. We described the story of Moses freeing the Jewish people from being slaves in Ancient Egypt. We have also been looking at the Shema and why it is so important to the Jewish people.

Year 6:

This week Year 6 spent time reading and thinking about the Nicene Creed. The children thought about what the words mean to them and then created a spiritual journal page to highlight the parts of the Creed that are important to them. We have also spent time every day this week praying the rosary.

In Art we looked at the artist Fiona Rae. We discussed how the art was created and then the children worked on creating a similar piece, focusing on different textures and creating a specific mood using different materials and colours.

Trek to Pakistan

The Spiritual Council have decided to rebrand the CAFOD 'Big LENT Walk' and they have chosen to do a sponsored walk to raise money for the communities in Pakistan who have been affected by flooding.

During the months of October and November, the children have been challenged to walk 3798miles (the distance from Englefield Green to Pakistan) and this equates to approximately 18 miles per child. This is a HUGE ask of the little legs in our school so some of the older children might like to do a few extra miles.
