The Week That Was

Year R:

This week, Reception have been learning about Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. We created a map of their journey in our small world so that we could re tell the story together. We have also been learning all about Autumn this week and have been reading the story "Don't hog the hedge". We sequenced the story using pictures and sound buttons and worked as a team to create a story map, showing all of the different creatures that Hattie the hedgehog meets on her journey. In maths we have been learning about circles and triangles and used our shape magnifying glasses to go on a shape hunt in EYFS. We used the iPads to take pictures of the objects we found that were shaped like a circle or triangle.

Year 1:

Year 1 have had another fabulous week! We began this week with our class mass. It was lovely to see so many parents there to support. The children all did amazingly and got 2 faith Dojo points for their hard work! In RE, we have moved on from The Annunciation to The Visitation, learning about how the Holy Spirit visited Mary's cousin Elizabeth. In Maths, we are continuing subtraction and making good progress. In English, we are guided writing the traditional tale, Little Red Riding Hood. We have made a slight adaptation and the wolf is now an evil baby! This is preparing the children for their first big write next week, where the children will rewrite the story with a different exciting change. We began DT for this first time this week, which is very exciting! The children have begun to construct their windmills. We discussed the importance of having a sturdy structure. Another great week!

Year 2:

In Year Two, we spent time looking at the use of oils in Baptism. It was interesting to see the link between oils used to make people stronger, and how oils are a symbol of making our faith stronger. In English, the class changed the tale of The Gingerbread Man, to the tale of The Little Red Tomato. We rewrote this as a class in preparation for next week when the children will write their own versions for their BIG write. In Maths, we finished the unit on addition and subtraction by looking at adding and subtracting over a 10. In History, the focus remains on The Gunpowder Plot with figuring out if Guy Fawkes was a hero or a villain! What do you think...? In RHE we looked at keeping safe online. It was interesting to have discussions about online usage and the different reasons the children use the internet for.

Year 3:

I year 3 we have started our new visitors topic in year 3. reflecting our how Advent is a time when we appreciate the love in our lives and prepare to celebrate love become a reality in the person of Jesus. We have also started to explore constructing castles out of 3D shapes in design & technology. Pupils should be collecting any junk material they may need for their designs over the next few weeks.

Year 4:

Year Four have had a great week, they are fascinated about learning about the Ancient Egyptians and have got a better understanding of how we discovered a way to understand hieroglyphs. We have had some interesting conversations in RHE

about changes and the feelings that can come up when changes happen. In English the children have started to think about ideas for a Myth or Legend of their own! They are all very excited about High Ashurst next week!

Year 5:

This week in RE, year 5's have been looking at ways in which we can remember, celebrate and respond to showing care and commitment. We have discussed how to show care and commitment in different facets of our lives and we have made links to religious beliefs, and how they have helped to shape our community.
