Dear All

Well, the weather has not been with us for most of this week but this has not dampened our spirit!

The children all had the opportunity to visit St Jude's School across the road to take part in the workshops provided by Wintershall. The children came back so enthused by their experiences and tales of the animals they'd seen (we could hear the donkeys from our playground!). The staff running the workshops asked that the message be communicated to me that they had never seen as well-behaved children as St Cuthbert's pupils!! So proud!!

The Y4 children had a great time at High Ashurst and the staff accompanying them said they were a dream! The children enjoyed a range of activities and came back exhausted but full of their stories.

I have noticed a few boys wearing thermal type leggings under shorts for PE. As per our uniform policy, the children can wear maroon jogging bottoms when the weather is colder. I would advise that children wear both shorts and jogging bottoms during these months so that they have the option to take a layer off.

Can I also remind parents about safety measures during drop off times. Between 8.30am and 8.40am can children coming through the KS1 entrance be escorted to the red gate, where a member of staff is situated, before being left. In the area by the KS2 gate children should be supervised until the gate is opened by a member of staff. Thank you for your cooperation in advance -safety is always our priority.

Earlier today you will have received an email with the link to a parent survey. We value your feedback and hope you will take a few minutes of your time to complete the online <u>questionnaire</u>—if possible by end of next week.

We have anti-bullying week next week when the children will be taking part in a range of activities on this theme. Travelling Nativity

The children first met Lucy, from Wintershall, who explained about the four weeks of Advent. The clas ses then went onto explore five different stations where they met various people from the advent story;

Mary, Melchior - one of the wise men, a shepherd and her (real life!) sheep, Zechariah - Elizabeth's husband and finally Sam the donkey and his owner.

At each station the children were provided with an item to reflect on. We will be focusing on these items in our prayer and liturgy time throughout advent.

Anna from Year Two said; It was really nice and the children enjoyed it because they got lots of gifts for Advent.

Rosie from Year Two said; I enjoyed meeting Mary the most because she was really nice. She was telling us about baby Jesus.

Teddy from Year Two said; I liked meeting the wise man, Melchior. He showed us the presents that the wise men delivered. These are myrrh, frankincense and gold. He gave us all a gem too!

The Week That Was

Year R:

This week, Reception were very lucky to visit the team at Wintershall, to hear more about Mary and Jospeh's journey to Bethlehem and the birth of baby Jesus. We were given gifts to collect on the way round, to signify each person we met on our journey. A donkey, a manger, some wool, a jewel and a feather. The children really enjoyed meeting the different characters on their journey. This week we have also been reading the story 'Stickman' and our learning has been all about winter. We talked about what we would do if we found stickman, then drew pictures to represent our ideas and labelled our pictures using our Fred talk.

Year 1:

Year 1 has had another fun-filled week of learning. In RE, we have been discussing the nativity and the birth of Jesus. This was supported beautifully by the children's trip to St Jude's to watch Wintershall actors depict the nativity. We have also begun learning our songs for the nativity play and have been making good progress. The children have done their first independent big write this week, by retelling Little Red Riding Hood. They made adaptions to the story and have been writing it all by themselves, this is very tricky but the children have all shown excellent resilience. A good week for all in Year 1.

Year 2:

In Year 2, we finished off our unit about Baptism by visiting Canon Chris at Church. We had a lovely visit where we reflected on the unit through prayers, and also a signs and symbols hunt. In History, it was the final week of learning about the Gunpower Plot before moving onto The Great Fire of London next week. The children wrote their BIG write story about their version of The Gingerbread Man. In Maths, we have been learning about shapes.

Year 3:

In year 3 we have been learning about how Isaiah announces the coming of God and how Gariel announces the coming of Jesus to Mary. We also had a visit from Wintershall and met Mary, the Shepards, the Wise Men and well as others who are a part of the advent story. In science we investigated various methods of seed dispersal in a seed triathlon to see which method was most effective and which seeds can travel the longest to survive.

Year 4:

Year Four enjoyed lots of fantastic team-building activities at High Ashurst this week. Many overcame their fears, as they tackled climbing high on the climbing walls and swinging through the trees on high ropes! They

learned how to build fires and dens and above all spent time working on their teamwork, resilience and communication skills. Returning to school, they have written some beautiful recounts of their time away! Well done for doing us all proud this week Year Four!

Year 5:

This week in RE we have learnt about the prophet Jeremiah and how he loved his fellow Jewish people. We discussed what sort of King God needed to send and how Jesus managed to fulfil his promises. We then completed different poems titled 'Servant King'.



Year 6:

This week Year 6 has been learning about Miriam and her role in the salvation story of the Old Testament. Miriam was brave; she was wise, and she taught her people to have hope and to show gratitude. The children also enjoyed their trip to the travelling Nativity – they particularly enjoyed collecting the different symbols from the different parts of the Nativity story.

We continued our work on the circulatory system. This week we discussed the role of the heart in pumping blood around the body as well as the purpose of blood and how it carries oxygen and nutrients to all parts of the body. In Maths we started our unit on Fractions focusing on creating equivalent fractions and simplifying.
