### PE and Clubs-FAQ

Following our email last week, we have received a few questions regarding PE and clubs which we thought we would answer via this newsletter.

### PE:

Each subject has a teacher who leads on it, which will be Mr John. He will be liaising closely with PS Sports Coaching who will deliver most of the PE lessons. St Cuthbert's will continue to be part of sporting events such as Cross Country and District Sports.

### Clubs:

Please note the time change for **Judo** on a Monday Morning. This will now be starting at **7.50am until 8.35am** in line with the tennis clubs on Tuesdays and Wednesdays as it will allow the children more time to get changed into their uniform / PE kit and be ready in class for their learning at 8.50am

**Netball Club:** This is available to boys and girls in year 4, 5 and 6 who will be training together. Based on numbers, there may be an opportunity to extend the club to year 3—we will look at this in the new year.

All outdoor sports clubs will be on in all weathers. In case of severe rain, we will make arrangements to bring the children indoors and either use the hall or studio.

### **After School Club:**

This will continue to run as usual. If your child is joining one of the sports clubs or Spanish, they will take themselves to after school club afterwards. Any girls who are signed up for football at St Jude's on a Thursday will walk back to St Cuthbert's with the coach if they are attending After School Club.

### The Week That Was

#### Year R:

This week Reception have been writing letters to Santa to tell him all about their Nativity show. We used our Fred Talk to help us write the words we needed, to tell him all about the different parts we played in the show. We have been practising our fine motor skills by making Christmas shapes in the play dough area using different cutters and using our knowledge of pattern and shape to decorate Christmas presents. We have really enjoyed taking part in lots of Christmas activities, talking about our plans for the Christmas holiday in circle time (and singing lots of Christmas songs!)

#### Year 1:

All the children have had another fabulous week, to top off a brilliant first term in Year 1. In RE this week, we learned about the ways in which Christians celebrate Christmas. We discussed the importance of the crib and what it symbolises. In maths we have continued with numbers to 20. The children have been working on ordering and estimating numbers on a number line. There has been great excitement in English writing. We are writing a response to Father Christmas. He sent a letter to all of the schools Elves asking how the children have prepared for Christmas. We told him about our nativity, decorations, travelling crib and so much more. The children have worked so hard and learned so much this term, they are overdue a well-earned rest! Hoping everyone has a lovely Christmas and Happy New Year.

#### Year 2:

What a wonderful half term we have had in Year Two. Thank you again for the very generous presents for our class team, it is lovely of you to think of us and much appreciated. This week, we finished off the RE unit around Advent as well as the unit in RE about getting help in an emergency. In Writing, the whole school had a writing task to accomplish - a mission set by Father Christmas to write to him to tell him all about how the children at St. Cuthbert's have been preparing for Christmas. Have a great Christmas break and we will see you in the new year.

### Year 3:

In RE we have been learning about Ordinary time and how we are reminded that God is always there to help us live as Christians. We have been writing letters to Father Christmas, informing him on how St Cuthbert's prepares during Advent for the birth of Jesus. Thank you so much for all your help and support this year. I hope you all have a well deserved rest surrounded by families and loved ones.

### Year 4:

Year Four have done fantastically on this last week of term! They did such a brilliant job in the Advent service and did us all very proud. They finished off their DT project and evaluated what they would do differently next time. They also got their artistic skills out for their Christmas cards! Well done for a fantastic term Year Four! Have a wonderful Christmas!

### Year 5:

This week In RE, we have been learning all about the arrival of Jesus and the Christmas Story. We have recapped how Advent is a time for waiting in hope and linked the words of the prophets Isiah and Jeremiah to the coming of the Messiah.

#### Year 6:

This week we made links between the Magnificat and stories from the Old and New Testament. Through our study of the

Gospel of Luke this half term, we have seen how Luke used references from the Old Testament to help people understand the importance of Jesus' birth.

We have come to the end of our DT unit – the children have all made a Christmas stocking working on sharpening their sewing skills including running stitch, blanket stitch and attaching a fastener in the form of a button.

The children did so well at the Advent service. I was very proud of all of them, our song was particularly tricky and they performed it beautifully.
