Another busy week as we move closer to half term!

Year 3 ventured to Butser Farm on Wednesday on a trip to support their studies of the Bronze and Iron Age. The children were able to take part in a range of activities to give them a taste of life in these times - everything from digging for artefacts to stone carving. This will enhance their learning in this topic immensely. Thank you so much to the parents that were able to accompany them.

The Year 6 children led a liturgy this morning and shared some of their learning experiences and talents. Our oldest children make such a positive contribution to school and are truly wonderful role models to our younger pupils.

Our Pupil Parliament took place today and the children with responsibilities did an amazing job of leading their group and holding a meeting. Discussions took place and all the children were given the opportunity to share their thoughts and ideas. We will aim to hold these meetings every half term to share the progress being made.

We have noticed in the mornings that some children are not supervised as they come into school. We have staff on both the Key Stage 1 (red gate) and Key Stage 2 gate from 8.40-8.50am and it is at these points that the children become the responsibility of the school. Some of the younger children are not being 'seen in' to this area and so there is a danger of children wandering back out of school. The safety of pupils is our top priority and ensuring their transition into our care is so important.

The Bishop is coming to lead my Induction mass on Sunday during the 11am service. Thank you in advance to the PTA who are taking care of refreshments and those of you bringing children to sing, I am so grateful for all the support.

In the coming week's gospel prayer and liturgy was are learning how Jesus' teaching was amazing, it changes people when they hear it, because what He says is spoken by God to show us who God is - are we ready to listen to Him?

And His teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, He taught them with authority. (Mark 1: 22)

The Week That Was

Year R:

This week, Reception have been exploring the story of 'Jack and the beanstalk'. We used our Fred talk to write describing words for the characters in the story and pretended to be Jack to write a sorry letter to the giant for stealing his things. We have been planting our own broad beans to create our own beanstalks, the children will be bringing their beanstalk home so that they can continue to watch them grow. In maths, we have been learning about mass and capacity. We have been comparing and ordering objects by mass using weighing scales and using different size and shaped containers to explore capacity in the water tray.

Year 1:

Year 1 have had another brilliant week. We continued learning about Jesus through St Luke's gospel. The children learned about when Jesus announced his mission and how he prioritised those on the fringes of society. We are discussing ways that we too can be like Jesus and welcome everyone. Maths is going well, the children have been doing number bonds to 20 which has been a bit tricky, but we're making good progress. They have begun their big writes this week, writing instructions on how to catch a fairytale animal of their choice! They have been developing their independence while writing sentences and are improving really nicely. Well done Year 1!

Year 2:

In Year Two, the children have written an information leaflet about the different books used in Mass. They also reflected in their spiritual journal about the Baptism of Jesus as this is a very important story in the New Testament. In Maths, the class are looking at money; comparing amounts and making the same amounts using different coins. In writing, the children were very excited to write in their BIG write book - I can't wait to read their adventure stories. In RHE the learning about money continued with how to keep money safe. You will be glad to know the children had some excellent ideas about how to look after their well earned pocket money.

Year 3:

In year 3 in RE we have been thoughtful of life, for people and gifts, in understanding how it is a vital part of our relationship with one another. When praise and appreciation are experienced, we are enabled to relate on a deeper level.
