The Week That Was

Year R: This week, Reception have been learning about Pentecost and discussing how the holy spirit was sent to help us. In English we have been reading the story "Dear Dinosaur", about a little boy that writes to a dinosaur pen pal. We have been composing our own questions that we would like to ask a dinosaur and writing letters, to send the dinosaur a message about us at St Cuthbert's. In Maths we have been focusing on the numbers 11-16. We have been practising how to "build" these numbers using different resources and using tens frames to order and compare the quantities.


Year 1: We have had another brilliant week in Year 1. In RE, the children had a visit from Canon Chris where we discussed the prayer Glory Be. We have been learning the scripture "The Road to Emmaus" in the lead up to Pentecost and the children role played the story beautifully! The children enjoyed our Science lesson this week. We have begun a new topic - types of animals. We made an A-Z of animals and had some amazing suggestions such as quail and ocelot. Our maths learning is centred around capacity at the minute. The children had fun comparing capacities of containers by filling them with water! In ICT, we have been using laptops to create groups. The children have been opening files, dragging things into groups using the touch-pad and saving files. Very well done this week, Year 1!

Year 2: In Year Two the class started a new unit of learning in RE based around Pentecost. To start, they have been learning about how messages are spread and they wrote a postcard to Jesus explaining why he is a hero. In Geography, the writing the children looked more closely at Newspaper Reports and dug deep into the 4W's. Maths has seen the continuation of fractions, with children learning about unit and non unit fractions. Art was fun this week, the class are learning about clay and how to join clay together using the score and slip method.

Year 3: In year 3 we have been learning about the gifts of the Holy Spirit and how they energise us. We have been exploring this topic in our diary big writes, imagining we have received one of these gifts. In science we have been investigating how hard/soft different rocks are with scratch tests. We are looking forward to next week. On Monday we will start our swimming lessons and on Thursday we have an exciting trip planned to Runnymede. We will be investigating the different listed sites and uncovering why they are protected.

Year 4: Year Four worked really hard to make sure they put together a fantastic class assembly this week, and didn't they do well? Well done, Year Four, all of your hard work paid off! They've also been planning a debate texts in English and learning about grouping living things in Science! They have been working really hard on their fractions and their times-tables!

Year 5: This week in RE, we have been comparing our own and other people's ideas about questions concerning giving and refusing to give and appreciating the cost of giving, whilst realising that these questions are difficult to answer. We have linked this to how feelings and beliefs affect giving and compared this with Jesus and the Easter story.



Year 6: On Tuesday afternoon Year 6 went to the Royal Holloway University to meet with the artist Sean Harris and the palaeontologist and climate scientist, Danielle Schreve. The children learnt about climate change, paleontology and stop motion animation. This is the start of a wonderful art project Year 6 will be doing. Watch this space for updates.

In RE we looked at faith – we discussed Jesus' appearances to his disciples and how difficult it was for his disciples to believe, even when He was standing right in front of them. We discussed how difficult it can be to believe something you cannot see and then talked about belief as a choice that we make every day.
