Y6 visited the church yesterday to look at the icons and art as part of their RE theme. It is such a great way to bring the children's learning to life.

Y5 had a visitor to talk to them about Anglo-Saxon life in Englefield Green yesterday. The children had the opportunity to deepen their learning of their history topic and ask questions.

It was lovely to see everyone in their Christmas jumpers today! Thank you so much for all your contributions to the food bank, as part of our reverse advent calendar, it is greatly appreciated. There was such a huge array of donations under the Christmas tree!

I am really looking forward to our KS2 advent service next Tuesday (16th) evening at 7pm in the church. This is always such a lovely event, and the children have been practising - they sound beautiful! There will be a practice in the church for the children involved on Monday (further details below).

Thank you so much to the parents who have offered to take part in our Careers Week in the new year. We are very grateful for your kind offers and will be in touch in the new year to arrange timings.

The children are working through glue sticks at a speedy rate at the moment! We would be very grateful if each child could add a glue stick to their Christmas list and bring one in labelled with their name when they return in January. Thank you in advance!

The Week That Was—KS1

Year R: This week Reception have been continuing their learning about the Christmas story. We listened to stories about how different families celebrate Christmas around the world and compared it to how our families celebrate. We have had a busy week with our KS1 Nativity with lots of rehearsals and performances. Thank you to everyone that came to see us, we hope you enjoyed it. In maths we have been learning about positional language. We have been practising using the phrases 'in front, behind, next to, on top' to describe the position of an object. In Literacy we have been reading the story "Kiffo" about a naughty elf that visits schools. We used our Fred talk to write the sentence "Elf on the shelf".

Year 1: Year 1 have had a brilliant week. We have been working so hard on the nativity and it all came together on Tuesday and Thursday. The children performed wonderfully and we were all so pleased! We have had some visitors to our classroom, Ned and Ted (the elves). Ned and Ted left the children a letter from Father Christmas. In it, Santa asked for the children to write back and tell him all about their preparations for Christmas. The children were very excited to do start their big writes this week and have all begun their independent letters to Santa.

Year 2: Year 2 have been looking at the advent wreath this week and all the meanings behind all the parts to it. The children were able to explain what each part was and label a drawing. In English we have been doing our guided write and changed our text to be about a diary of someone who saw the Great Fire of London. This helped the children think about all the things we have learnt in history. In Maths we have been looking at shape and the children have done such a good job at remembering all the tricky names for the shapes. This week was also a big week for the children as we got to show you our nativity. The children have worked so hard and were so happy to be able to show you what we had done. It was a great week with the children even though our days have been a little different. Well done Year 2, amazing work.

The Week That Was—KS2

Year 3: Year 3 have had a wonderfully busy and creative week! In RE, the children explored the importance of Advent by crafting our own Advent wreaths and were fortunate to take part in an inspiring Godly Play session of the Advent story. In Science, they investigated magnets and even designed our own magnetic tools to help people retrieve objects more easily across different surfaces. Our DT sessions were filled with excitement as the children designed and constructed their own castles, using a mixture of 3D nets and junk-modelling, before proudly decorating them and adding their very own flags. In History, the class revisited their earlier workshop on Stonehenge, researching how it may have been built and exploring the different interpretations of how the enormous stones were transported to their famous location.

Year 4: This week in RE, Year 4 explored the season of Advent and what it means to “prepare the way for the Lord.” We studied scripture from the Gospel of Mark and made connections between the words of the prophet Isaiah, John the Baptist’s message, and how Catholics prepare today during Advent. To put our learning into action, we created a fun ‘Make a Straight Path’ Board Game, where each space suggests a small way to prepare our hearts during Advent. In English, we focused on non-chronological reports. After a guided write about AI and its helpful role in schools, we independently planned and wrote our own AI-themed reports—showing creativity and clear structure. In Maths, we worked hard on multiplication and division facts for the 3, 6, 9, and 7 times tables, building fluency and confidence. Finally, in DT, we proudly completed our book cover designs, showcasing both skill and imagination.

Year 5: In Y5 this week, the class have been looking at Psalm 23, 'The Lord in my Shepherd.' They looked at this in different forms including a sung version as well as a storybook that shows this psalm with a modern twist. In English, the class have been writing their first draft of their persuasive leaflet. The class will continue to edit this and eventually write their final version in their big write books. In Maths, fractions have continued. This has got a little trickier with adding mixed numbers together but this children are remembering the method and are working hard to understand the concept. In History, the class had a visitor from Egham Museum. He spoke with he class about Anglo Saxons in the local area - from Staines to Englefield Green. It was very informative and brought the children's local area knowledge to life. It is the final lesson in RSE this week and the children thought about their own personal goals in 'Aiming High.' They thought about how they can contribute their steps to success to achieve well in the future. The class, alongside the rest of KS2, have been working hard in Advent Service rehearsals. It is looking lovely and we are excited to share this with you next week.

Year 6: Year 6 enjoyed a wonderful morning at the Church exploring its beautiful artwork. Canon Chris shared fascinating insights into the symbolism behind each piece, which inspired the children to create their own drawings and thoughtful annotations. Their respect and creativity were truly impressive! In History, we’ve been investigating what happened to the Maya civilization. The class engaged in lively discussions about the different theories and considered which explanations seemed most convincing. Our RE focus has been on the role of women in the Church and the significant impact they have had on our own faith journeys. Alongside all this learning, we’ve been busy preparing for Advent. The children are excited to share their special Advent service with you soon. It promises to be a meaningful celebration of this important season.

Christmas Jumper Day in Support of Runnymede Foodbank

Each year, at this time of receiving, we feel it is important to ensure we give a little too. The children are encouraged to wear their Christmas jumper in exchange for donating an item to Runnymede Foodbank. The Christmas tree was full of presents that Claire McAdam, Foodbank rep from the Our Lady of the Assumption, and Myra from Runnymede Foodbank came and collected. They also spoke with the children to thank them for their generosity.

Thank you to all of the families for their donations - it really does mean a lot to be able to put into action the Catholic Social Teaching principle of 'preferential option for the poor' at this time of the year.



CAFOD Fundraiser

Dear Parents,

Last weekend, in Weybridge all the former Deanery Parishes came together as we seek to work as one parish in the building of God's Parish, we priests were well supported by M.Ps, Diocesan Staff and our Schools. Thank you to Mrs Rainbow and Mrs Gray for coming to support us in our onward journey. As many of you know, I have been appointed as "Moderator of the Clergy Team", which means I will be involved in a lot of work for the whole new parish, in addition to my current duties. Please bear this in mind and bear with me, especially during the transition period.

Thank you once again to all the lovely Year 4, 5, and 6 pupils who celebrated so reverently the Sacrament of Reconciliation for Advent. It was lovely to see the non-Catholic pupils too as we reflected together. It was also wonderful to celebrate the "Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament" and "Benediction". It was put into an advent context with "Stop – Look – Listen ... and then stay awake and alert"! Many of the children agreed to keep up a short period of reflection between then and Christmas – I hope it is going well?

I really enjoyed welcoming the year 6 group to the church for a session on our "religious art". We have some historical pieces and some recent pieces with connections to current and past pupils and their extended families. It was a very peaceful and prayerful experience and edifying too. In the afternoon I greatly enjoyed the EYFS and Key Stage 1 nativity and Christmas gathering - thank you to you all!

This year instead of more chocolates and biscuits for the staff, we in the parish are making two Christmas gifts on behalf of the school and through the charity "Mary's Meals". We will be feeding children for a whole year - two on behalf of the teachers and staff; and two on behalf of the children and their families.

I look forward to seeing many of you for Gaudete Sunday this weekend and please see our list of Masses and times over Christmas. For those who I will not see – those who will be away, are from other parishes, or non-Catholic, can I wish you and your families a very Happy Christmas.

Parish of Weybridge

As of 7th December, the school is now located in the Parish of Weybridge, instead of the familiar Parish of St. Cuthbert.

Bishop Richard celebrated Mass on Sunday 7th December with all of the former parishes within the Deanery of Weybridge. The Deanery of Weybridge is no longer and is now one Parish inline with the Bishop's pastoral plan.

The plan 'The Word who is Life' sets out an important stage in the development of Diocesan structures, with the 11 deaneries becoming 11 Parishes. The idea is that the communities within the parish will work together and build faith across many communities. The logo is poignant to the new Parish.

The central image is a tree – a tree implies life, strength, roots, steady growth, and beauty.

- The parish logo is formed of the names of all the churches in the new parish
- A tree breathes life into our planet
- A tree undergoes regular change
- The branches and leaves, like our community of communities, form one entity
- The shape of the logo reminds us of a monstrance, and the centrality of the Eucharist
- With eight leaves on the tree, we recall the Beatitudes

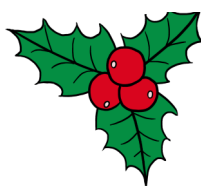

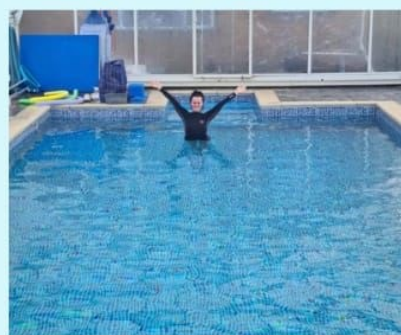
