We closed our half term and the month of May with our Marion procession this morning, led by our Y4 children. Mrs Protheroe, our Prayer and Liturgy lead, guided the children to present a beautiful service that left the whole school in a state of peace.

The Y2 assembly was amazing yesterday! The children were full of energy and keen to share their learning. It was such a delight to see their smiling faces and as they delivered their lines and sung songs.

The Y6 children are full of the excitement of auditions and allocation of parts for their play. I have already seen many of them learning lines in the playground - such dedication!

Can I remind parents of our school uniform policy as we seem to have quite a few children wearing clear, flat earrings. We also have children wearing trainers with their uniforms - these are only allowed on PE days. Thank you for your cooperation in reinforcing these expectations.

Another reminder that we have an INSET day on the first Monday back - so we will see you on Tuesday 2nd June!

After half term we explore one of the amazing mysteries of faith — The Holy Trinity. The children will be invited to experience the great love God has for each of us and have the opportunity to express their faith in the Trinity — Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

## The Week That Was - KS1

**EYFS:** This week Reception have been learning about being part of a community. We discussed the communities we are a part of by reading the story "A Handful of Buttons" and used buttons as faces to create our own button family and community pictures. In Maths we have been exploring even and odd numbers with the Number blocks and tested different numbers to see if they were odd or even by trying to share them equally. We have also been reading the story "Martha Maps It Out in Time" and learning about the past, present and future. We then made timelines of our own personal history.

**Year 1:** Year 1 have had another fantastic week and have worked so hard across all their learning! In RE, the children learned all about Pentecost. We spent time thinking about how prayer helps us to grow in our faith, and the children are becoming much more confident saying the words of the *Glory Be* prayer. In Maths, we have been learning about finding fractions of quantities and shapes, and the children have shown great understanding with this. In English, the children have been independently writing their own diary entries. It has been wonderful to see them using the skills they have developed this year, including writing in the first person and using correct punctuation. In Art, we created our very own pop-up art gallery to showcase our "Woven Wonders." The children were very proud to share their work, and we were delighted to welcome Mrs Classen, Year 6, and Mrs Rainbow to come and visit. Well done, Year 1, for such a brilliant week. We hope you all enjoy a very well-deserved break!

**Year 2:** Year 2 have been learning more about the Fruits of the Holy Spirit and just how much then can help us be the best we can be. In Maths we have been looking at number problems and finding the best way to solve them that works for us. In Science we have been doing lots of investigating different materials and whether they can twist and squash. We used magnifier glasses to look at these close up. In Geography we have looked at the 7 wonders are where they are, looking at these on a map and trying to find them. We have done a lot of practice on our assembly this week and the children have worked so hard so we hope you enjoyed coming to see all of their learning. Well done Year 2 for being so resilient this week! Have a great half term!

## The Week That Was - KS2

**Year 3:** This week, we have been incredibly busy and have shown fantastic enthusiasm across all areas of our learning. In RE, we explored the concept of the *Holy Trinity*, where we learnt about the mystery of faith and how God can be understood as three parts — the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit — yet still be one God, leading to some thoughtful discussions where we shared and reflected on our own ideas. In Science, we became hands-on investigators as we explored the soil around our school grounds, identifying what it contains, including different particles, plant matter and small organisms, and we had great fun creating our own “soil mixtures” to understand how soil is formed. In Maths, we have been working hard on time, solving word problems involving years, months, days, hours and minutes; although this has been challenging, we have shown great perseverance by using manipulatives and supporting one another to build our confidence and understanding. In Writing, we have been busy crafting our own imaginative portal stories, where we used direct speech, fronted adverbials, and expanded noun phrases to engage the reader and enhance our storytelling, and we are very proud of how our creativity and writing skills have developed this week.

**Year 4:** This week in Year 4, the children learnt about the Four Marks of the Catholic Church in RE and explained how the Church is One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic. They designed and drew images to show what each mark means, adding key words to demonstrate understanding, before taking part in a gallery exhibition to learn from one another. In English, the class boxed up and guided wrote a discussion text on whether screen time should be limited, sharing their views and applying their discussion toolkit. In Maths, they continued working on money, comparing, estimating and calculating amounts, and are now ready to begin their Time topic next week. In Geography, the children explored how major earthquakes affect people, practised Japan’s earthquake drill—*Drop, Cover, Hold On*—and created a case study of the 2011 Japan tsunami. In Art, they produced their own batik pieces, and in Science they sorted and analysed evidence collected from the local environment to deepen their understanding of living things and habitats.

## The Week That Was - KS2

**Year 5:** In Year Five this week, the class have been thinking about discipleship; specifically looking at Mary and using her as an example for what this looks like. English has been BIG write week meaning the class have been editing their draft newspaper article and rewriting this using their best handwriting, correct spelling and best punctuation. I will look forward to marking these over the half term ahead of Summer Term 2. In Maths, the children completed the unit on position and direction and have moved onto a new unit based on decimals. The class worked together to make complements to 1 as well as adding and subtracting decimals. In Geography, perspectives of other people were looked at in relation to trade. The class interviewed each other and gave opinions based on locally produced goods as well as imported items.

**Year 6:** This week, Year 6 has been exploring the importance of charity and how we can share the Good News through acts of kindness and service to others. We focused on the inspiring work of **Mary's Meals**, learning how this charity provides daily meals to children in some of the world's poorest communities, helping them to access education. In Art, the children proudly completed their Sculpture and 3D unit by designing and creating their own **memory boxes**. These thoughtful creations reflect personal memories and ideas, showcasing creativity and careful craftsmanship. In English, our writing focus has been on building suspense. The children have been developing their use of short sentences, slowing the pace of their narrative, and applying the 'show, not tell' technique to engage the reader. Another busy week in Year 6!

## Arbor Parent Portal



We are pleased to confirm that we are now going to start using **Arbor Parent Portal**.

Below we've outlined some of the benefits that you will receive as a result of the move to Arbor. The next step will be an automated email from Arbor with instructions on how to login to the parent portal. Please keep a look out in your inbox (junk mailbox) over the coming days.

The app is free to download on both the AppStore (iOS) and Google PlayStore (Android). We are not moving over to the payment system straight away to ensure that we are rolling each facet of the application out carefully. Therefore, you will still need Tucasi/ ScoPay for the time being for school trip payments, house t-shirts payments, etc.

Arbor will allow you, as parents, to be able to do the following, all from the same app:

- Receive & reply to messages from school (free of charge)
- Add or edit information for yourself and your child- phone number(s), address etc.
- Give consent for medication, trips, photos etc.
- Access key data - such as attendance

Once you are in the app please use this as an opportunity to carefully check that your contact details are correct. Please also make sure that we have at least 3, ideally 4 or more emergency contacts for your child, this can be another parent from school or family member/friend who can help get a message to the primary guardians in an emergency.

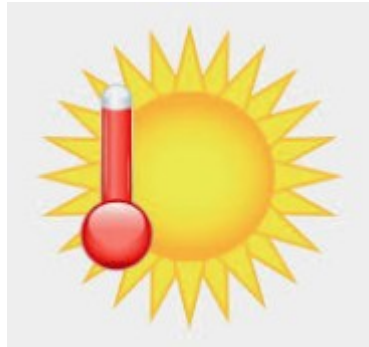

## 10 Top Tips for Parents and Carers

# ONLINE SAFETY FOR UNDER 5S

According to Ofcom's most recent research, a significant proportion of children are already online by the time they start school, with 17% of 5-year-olds owning their own mobile phone and 50% using messaging platforms. There is an increase in parents of 3-5 year-olds who say their child uses social media apps or sites. In 2021 and 2022 about a quarter of 3-5 year olds whose parents have said their child used social media apps or sites has risen to three in ten (29%) in 2023, and almost four in ten (37%) this year. As becoming familiar with technology is generally encouraged in younger children – and has been essential for education during the pandemic – it is now more than ever essential that trusted adults recognise both the benefits and the risks of infants and toddlers going online. We've compiled our top tips to help the under-5s start their online safety journey.

### 1 USE DEVICES TOGETHER

This lets you monitor and control what your child is using the device for. Co-viewing also provides the interaction that supports children's understanding of what they are seeing, discussing content – allowing them to ask you questions, and so on.

### 2 ACTIVATE PARENTAL CONTROLS

Most digital devices have built-in parental controls that can limit the type of content they have access to and can support, rather than replace, active supervision. Social media and AI toys should be avoided. If your child uses any device (even borrowing yours), it is a good idea to explore what controls the device has and enable them whenever they have access to it.

### 3 MANAGE SCREEN TIME

This can be tricky, especially if your child is interested in a certain video, app or game. Try to agree on some ground rules and get your child into a routine which includes certain times of the day without devices. According to the new guidance, you need to limit total screen time for young children, wherever possible. Under 2 years: screen time should be avoided, other than for shared activities with family that encourage bonding, interaction and conversation. 2-5 years: should try to keep screen time to 1 hour a day and even less if possible.

### 4 IF IN DOUBT, ASK

The easiest way to find out what your child is doing online is usually just to talk about it with them. Developing an open dialogue at an early age helps them grow up feeling able to talk to you about their digital life – providing opportunities to intervene if you're concerned.

### 5 SET A GOOD EXAMPLE

Children often learn by watching and copying those around them, and using digital devices is no exception. When you're around your child, try to follow the same rules that you've set for them. Let them see you balancing your time online with interacting with people in real life, too. Try to keep routines such as meals or before bedtime screen-free, alternative suggestions can be background music, simple conversations, table games, colouring or 'I spy' with colours or letters.

### 6 BLOCK IN-APP PURCHASES

If your child uses a device that's linked to a payment method (such as a bank card), use the parental controls to block buys from app stores, as well as in-app purchases. That will prevent your child from accidentally spending money while on your device.

### 7 CHOOSE SAFE APPS AND SITES

There are some fantastic apps and platforms that are specifically designed to be safer for children. Always check the PEGI age rating before downloading an app and test it yourself before allowing your child to use it. Choose slow-paced, age-appropriate content and being mindful of risks such as autoplay features, algorithm-driven content, and in-app adverts or purchases.

### 8 INVOLVE THE FAMILY

If your toddler has older siblings, it's likely that their rules for device use will be different – and that they'll access content that isn't appropriate for younger ones (a particular worry if they share devices). Encourage your whole family to be good role models and help little ones stay safe online.

### 9 TALK ABOUT BEING SAFE ONLINE

Just like we teach children about being safe in the real world, we need to educate them about how to stay safe online. Use age-appropriate language to help them understand, and plenty of hand gestures can reinforce what you're telling them.

### 10 SUPPORT CREATIVE AND ACTIVE PLAY

Physical and creative activities are important for a child's wellbeing, and there are plenty of ways to incorporate technology into that. For example, you could encourage games that require physical movement; dance and sing along to songs your child loves; and follow step-by-step crafting videos. Screens should not replace key aspects of early development, such as sleep, physical play, and interaction with adults.
