The Week That Was - KS1

This week has been a busy week with lots of special events happening and Reception have particularly enjoyed watching the Year 6 performance on Monday and the performance from the choir on Wednesday. Reception class have also been finishing their learning about under the sea and pirates this week and we have been enjoying lots of pirate themed stories together and making the most of the sunshine by playing in our outdoor area and making up our own pirate themed adventures! Year 1: Year 1 has had a brilliant week to finish off a fantastic year! We completed our maths learning by exploring time, focusing on o'clock and half past. The children have also taken part in a variety of quizzes to help us reflect on and celebrate all the learning they have achieved this year.

On Thursday, we enjoyed a beautiful Thanksgiving Mass, which marked the end of a wonderful school year. What a year it has been!

It has been an absolute pleasure getting to know all of the Year 1 children. Each and every one of them is special, funny, hardworking and capable. We have thoroughly enjoyed teaching them and are incredibly proud of everything they have achieved. We wish them every success as they move on to Year 2 and continue their learning journey.

Year 2: Year 2 have learnt about the importance of learning and respecting other religions. We had great discussions and the children articulated their ideas well. In Science we looked at the plants we grew and saw which was the best environment for the plants to grow in. We also made our quizzes in computing where the children got to design their own on scratch and watch how they all played out with the characters which was lots of fun. The children worked hard this week even in the heat and they enjoyed some fun activities at the end to celebrate the year they have completed. The children have had a great year and it has been a pleasure to teach them! I will miss them lots but hope they have the best summer!

The Week That Was - KS2

Year 3: As we reach the end of our Year 3 journey, we have been taking time to celebrate all the wonderful memories, learning, and friendships we have made together. It's hard to believe how quickly the year has flown by! We have had such a fantastic time together, and we are incredibly proud of everything we have achieved. While there is a little sadness in saying goodbye to Year 3, we are also filled with excitement as we look ahead to Year 4 and all the new adventures waiting for us. This week, in Computing, we became game designers, using Scratch to create our own maze programs and carefully coding sprites to travel from start to finish. In Writing, we completed our non-chronological reports, bringing our final pieces of Year 3 writing to a proud close. In RE, we explored beautiful examples of Islamic geometric art, discovering how these patterns can be seen in both impressive buildings and prayer mats. As we finish the year, we would like to thank all of our families for their support, encouragement, and kindness.

Year 4: Wow, what a fantastic final week in Year 4 we have had! We started the week in RE, exploring our *Encounter* topic. Our learning focus was The Five Pillars of Islam, where we learned to describe the Five Pillars and explain why they are such an important part of the Islamic faith for Muslims. In Maths, we practised translating coordinates on a grid and demonstrated excellent problem-solving skills. During RSE and Citizenship, we explored the topic of global warming, discussing its impact on our world and thinking about the positive actions we can take to help protect the environment. In Science, we created flowcharts to show the process of tooth decay, helping us understand the importance of good oral hygiene. Our Computing lessons saw us using Scratch to animate our names. The children showed great creativity and growing confidence in their coding skills. As the week drew to a close, we were reverent and respectful during our End of Year Thanksgiving Mass, reflecting on all that we have achieved this year. We also had lots of fun taking part in our end-of-year quizzes and games, celebrating a wonderful year of learning together.

It has been a pleasure to teach such a hardworking, enthusiastic and caring class. I wish all of Year 4 and their families a happy, safe and restful summer break!

Year 5: In Year Five, we have had a wonderful week of finishing units and end of unit assessment quizzes. 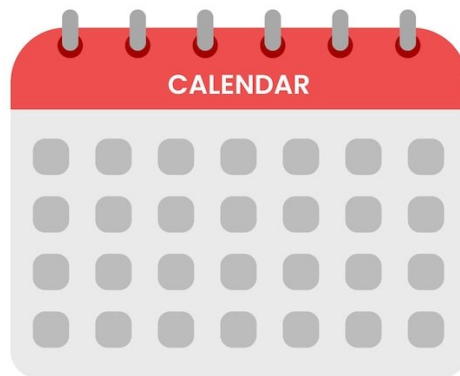

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about KEEP CHILDREN SAFE ONLINE OVER SUMMER

School's out ... for summer! Yes, it's that time of the year again: around six weeks at home for ecstatic youngsters. For many young people, a bumper stint off school means a welcome chance to spend even more time with their games console, phone, tablet or smart TV. So whether your children are likely to be scrolling on Snapchat, nesting in front of Netflix or trying foes on Fortnite, we've put together some top tips to help you keep them safe online this holiday.

THERE'S NO NETWORK LIKE HOME

Teenagers, especially, tend to be delighted to find that a coffee shop, restaurant or shopping centre offers free WiFi. These public networks are much less secure than home WiFi, though, so discourage your child from making online purchases or entering personal details when out and about.

KEEP TALKING

It sounds blindingly obvious, but having regular chats with your child about who they're talking to online, what games and apps they're using and what shows they're streaming is a huge benefit. It doesn't have to be every day or even every week, but it can signal potential issues well in advance.

WATCH FOR EXCESSIVE GAMING

With no school, children often take every opportunity to fit in 'just one more go' on their favourite game – sometimes at the cost of their daily routine, or having family time. A little extra gaming is to be expected in the holidays, but it could become problematic if it evolves into a recurring habit.

LIMIT SOCIAL AUDIENCES

When they're old enough, young people love to broadcast their summer holiday highlights all over social media. The unfortunate truth, however, is that we don't always know who might be viewing this content. Check the settings to ensure that only friends and family can see your child's posts.

DEMONSTRATE GOOD HABITS

Children often learn their digital behaviour from watching the grown-ups around them. So make sure your child observes you being positive and supportive on social media, for example – and, especially, sees that you know when it's time to switch the screen off, even though you're having fun.

IT'S 'THE GREAT OUTDOORS' FOR A REASON

For most northern hemisphere dwellers, this time of year is a rare opportunity to enjoy the outside world in pleasant weather. Remind your child how amazing it is to feel the sun on their back and fresh air in their lungs. Blarney and Minecraft will still be there on drizzly Sundays in October.

LIGHTS OUT, SCREENS OFF

This is a golden rule: try to limit how much screen time your child has towards end of the day. Staring at the screen of a phone or tablet for too long before bed severely impacts a child's quality of sleep – which can play havoc with their concentration, mood and energy levels the next day.

PRIVATE INFO STAYS PRIVATE

It's worth checking your child's social media or gaming profiles occasionally to make sure they aren't inadvertently giving away too much information. Details such as their full name, address or where they go to school could all be used to track them down by individuals with sinister intentions.

FOCUS ON FACTS

The internet is phenomenal at spreading gossip. When children of certain ages aren't in daily contact at school, the digital rumour mill can go into overdrive. Remind your child not to believe everything they're told online – especially if the person involved isn't around to provide their side of the story.

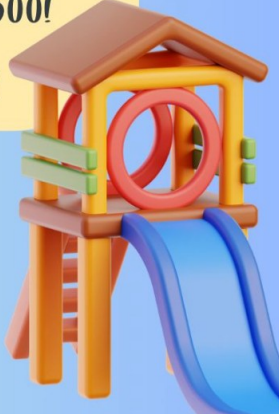

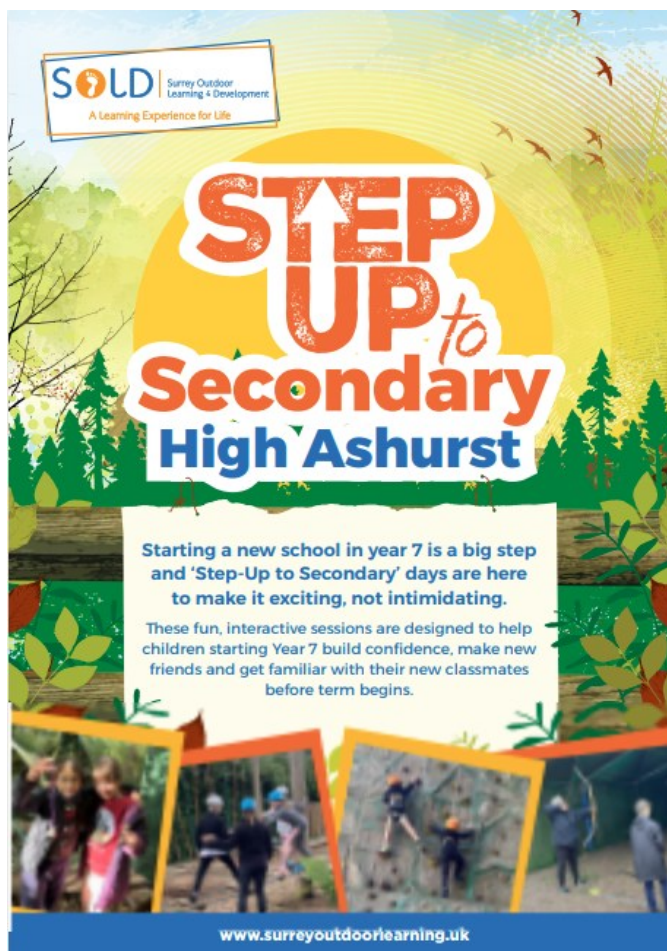
